



East Parkway Safe Stay Fact Sheet

Funded by two successful grant rounds from the California Department of Health Care Services Behavioral Health Bridge Housing (BHBH), the East Parkway Safe Stay Community provides housing and support for Behavioral Health clients. The Homeless Engagement and Response Team (HEART) plays a crucial role in assessing eligibility and facilitating placement of BHBH-eligible individuals within the community.

About the living spaces

The community offers:

- 56 beds in sleeping cabins.
 - 8 tri-plex single occupancy buildings and 4 duplex with double occupancy cabins are available for self-identified adult family members.
- East Parkway allows residents to bring service animals/pets.
- Site includes the following amenities:
 - \circ Bathrooms
 - \circ Showers
 - o Laundry
 - o Community Room

Operations and Security

The East Parkway Safe Stay Community, operated by CityNet, provides a secure and supportive environment for residents. CityNet also manages the Florin Road Safe Stay and will oversee operations at the upcoming Watt Safe Stay Location. CityNet is responsible for:

- Implementing comprehensive security measures including 24/7 on-site personnel to ensure the safety of both residents and the surrounding neighborhood.
- Maintaining a closed campus environment for the well-being of residents visitors are not permitted to ensure privacy, safety and stability.

East Parkway Safe Stay Eligibility Process:

For eligibility consideration and to make a referral:

- Submit a completed <u>Bridge Housing Eligibility and Prioritization</u> System (BHEPS)

On-site Support Services

Guests of the East Parkway Safe Stay Community have access to:

- Three meals provided daily
- Transportation services
- Access to support services, including but not limited to:
 - o Behavioral Health Services
 - Substance Use Prevention and Treatment services
 - Benefit acquisition assistance
 - Housing navigation
 - Crisis stabilization
 - Intensive care coordination
 - o Mental health groups
 - Connection with Peer Support (individuals with lived experience)

Campus costs

- Total Capital Investment: Approximately \$5,516,000. This figure includes the purchase of sleeping cabins, construction expenses, and soft costs (design, planning, permitting, etc.).
- Annual Operating Cost: ~\$2,880,000
