

THE FACTS ABOUT HOMELESSNESS IN SACRAMENTO COUNTY

The **Department of Homeless Services and Housing (DHS)** was created to coordinate the response of various County departments to provide services to those experiencing homelessness in Sacramento County, as well as mitigating the impacts of homelessness on the community. DHS staff work on long term programs and solutions to homelessness, provide regular report outs to the Board of Supervisors (BOS), and engage with a variety of community stakeholders on solutions.

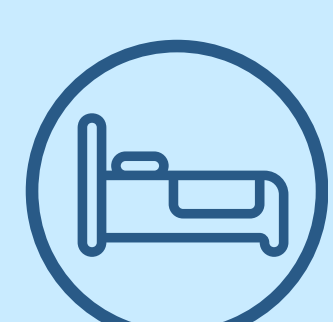

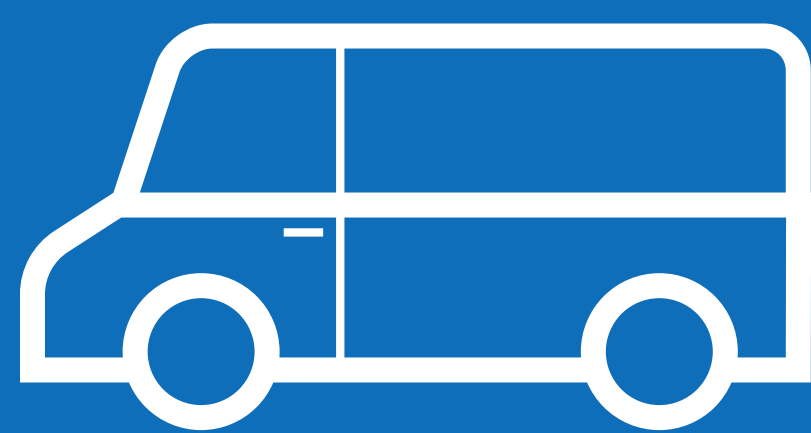
