The State of Homelessness in **Sacramento County**

The 2024 Point in Time Count (PIT) estimates there are 6,615 people living unhoused in Sacramento County on any given night. Of those, 59 percent of those are living unsheltered – which means they are living in a tent, a vehicle or without any shelter.

Sacramento County's Fiscal Commitment to Addressing Homelessness

In Fiscal Year 23/24, it is estimated that Sacramento County committed approximately \$220 million in funding to provide services and supports to those experiencing homelessness.

There are approximately 2,400 emergency shelter beds throughout Sacramento County, serving individuals, families, and transition age youth. Most are available year-round; some are seasonally opened during inclement weather. The County currently funds about 940 of these beds, with another 400 set to welcome guests in 2024/2025.
