The Basics

The Stockton Safe Stay Community has:

- 175 beds in sleeping cabins - including some double occupancy cabins for self-identified couples/adult families
- Bathroom and Shower facilities
- Community Room
- Dog Run
- Laundry Services

Operations and Security

The Stockton Blvd Safe Stay Community is operated by First Step Communities (FSC) - which currently operates both the North A congregate shelter and weather respite for the County.

FSC is responsible for:

- 24/7 security on-site for the safety of the guests, as well as the surrounding community. It is a closed campus - no visitors for the guests staying at the facility
- Providing for the basic needs of the Safe Stay guests including meals, oversight, case management, transportation and connection to additional County services

On-site Support Services

Guests of the Stockton Safe Stay Community receive three meals a day and have access to:

- Community Room
- Computer Lab
- Behavioral health services
- Basic Primary Health care
- Case management
- Rapid Re-Housing services
- Ready to Rent class

Campus Funding

- The construction costs of the facility were covered by the State of California.
- The three-year operational costs are funded by the Encampment Resolution Funds (ERF) grant as a result of the County/City Partnership agreement
