Florin Road Safe Stay Shelter

What: A non-congregate homeless shelter with wraparound supportive services

Where: 8144 Florin Rd, Sacramento, CA 95828

Occupancy Capacity: 125 guests total; 75 single cabins & 25 double cabins

Operator: City Net with funding from the County of Sacramento

Why: To provide shelter and supportive services to residents living unsheltered with the goal of helping people transition to long-term stable housing

Design: Cabin-style temporary shelter for individuals and two-person households; an indoor dining area; showers; restrooms; pet area; bike racks; resource center for program participants

Employees: 25+ on-site, including shelter manager, site supervisors, case managers, housing navigators, guest engagement associates, etc.









GET INVOLVED

How can the community get involved?

City Net accepts in-kind donations by appointment only. To schedule a donation drop-off, email getinvolved@citynet.org.

Accepted donations include, but aren't limited to:

- Hygiene supplies (shampoo, conditioner, body wash, toothbrushes, toothpaste, feminine hygiene, incontinence supplies, etc.)
- NEW emergency clothing staples (t-shirts, sweats/shorts, socks, undergarments, etc.)
- Gift cards of various values

The minimum age for volunteers is 18 years of age. Each volunteer must complete a volunteer application/waiver and be cleared prior to arrival. No walk-up volunteers will be permitted on-site.

Can community groups serve a meal at the shelter?

Meal groups are required to submit a Food Service Application and provide proof of an up-to-date certification from a California Approved (ANSI) Food Handler Safety Course. Meals can also be purchased from a local food establishment.

All meal groups must be pre-approved and scheduled in advance. This shelter does not accept unscheduled drop-offs under any circumstances.
