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UNINCORPORATED & PARKWAY OUTREACH

January – December 2023

22 FTE contracted outreach staff + 4 behavioral health clinicians & peers

Deployment via:

- *Proactive, County identified priority encampments*
- *Response driven needs with Sheriff, Rangers, others*
- *Dedicated ‘office hour’ spaces in suburban areas & Parkway*

Encampment Services Team (EST)

- Targeted, large(r) encampments in unincorporated areas
- Navigators + behavioral health staff

Parkway

- Camps and individuals in Parkway system
- Coordinated with ranger & parks staff
- Navigators + behavioral health staff

Community Based Outreach (C-BO)

- Established ‘office hours’ in three locations
- “Walk ins” and coordinated referrals from community partners
- Navigators with referrals into behavioral health

UNINCORPORATED & PARKWAY OUTREACH

January – December 2023

- County outreach teams engaged with 55 encampments and provided 16 consistent outreach drop-in locations throughout the unincorporated county and American River Parkway.
- Collectively, teams enrolled 1,284 unduplicated individuals into county outreach programs.
- Team provided 34,948 services* including:
 - Shelter assessments and placements
 - Connections to community resources
 - Securing vital documents
 - Basic needs supplies
 - Transportation assistance



*averaging 27 services per client

UNINCORPORATED & PARKWAY OUTREACH

January – December 2023

- **350** unduplicated individuals transitioned out of unsheltered homelessness representing approximately 35% of all program exits.

Exit Type	Percentage
Permanent Housing	11%
Temporary Housing	2%
Shelter/Interim Housing	22%

County Behavioral Health Services

- **351** individuals were enrolled/referred in one or more county specialty mental health program.
- **210** individuals were linked to a county specialty mental health program and received their first service.

FLORIN/POWER INN SAFE STAY

August 2023 – February 2024

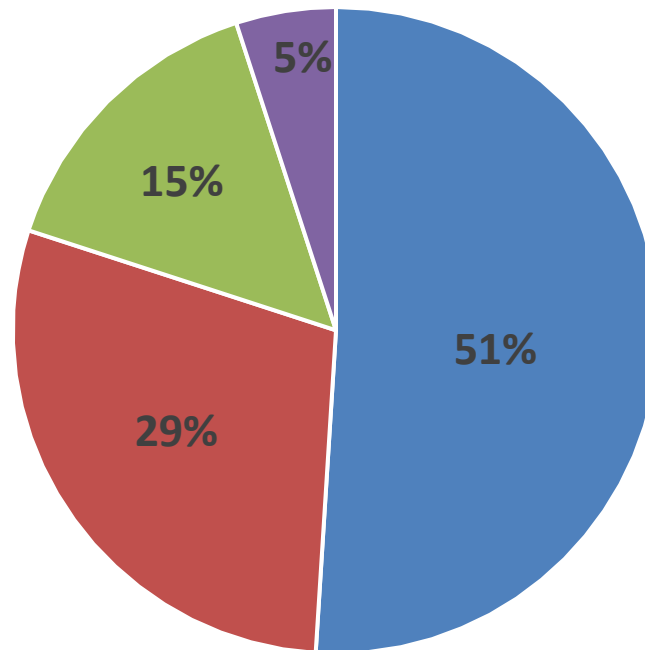
- The Board approved the Florin Safe Stay in June of 2022.
- On August 14, 2023, the first guests were welcomed during the ‘soft’ opening.
- Florin reached full occupancy on December 22, 2023, and has maintained an average 94% occupancy rate.
- Access is currently managed outside of Coordinated Access, with referrals from:
 - County Outreach Teams:
 - Community HealthWorks (CoHeWo)
 - Homeless Engagement and Response Team (HEART)
 - Sheriff Homeless Outreach Team (HOT)
 - City of Sacramento’s Department of Community (DCR)
 - BACS Core Wellness Center

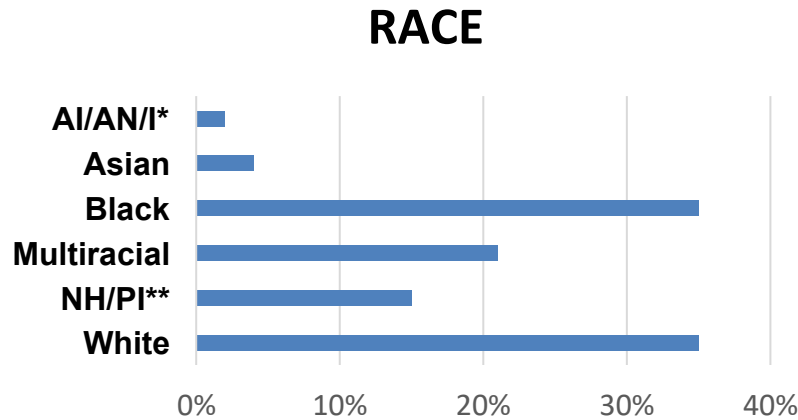
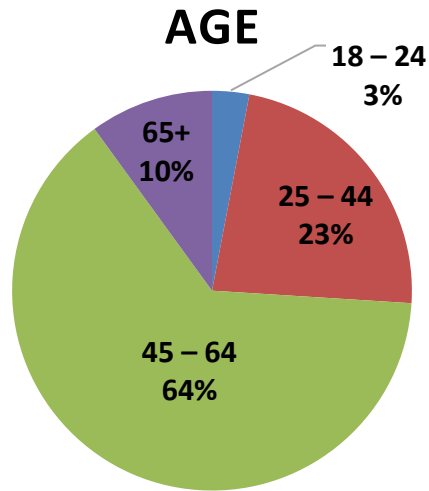
Referrals by Source



■ CoHeWo ■ DCR ■ Core Centers ■ HEART

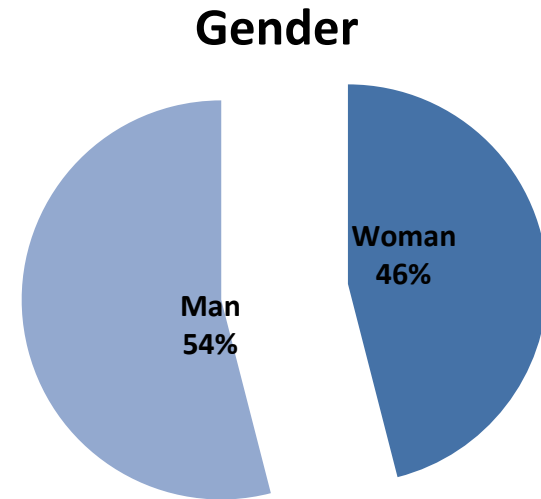

FLORIN/POWER INN SAFE STAY

August 2023 – February 2024

24% of exits by clients have been to positive destinations

Exit Type	Percentage
Permanent Housing	23%
Temporary Housing	1%

County Behavioral Health Services

- **47** individuals were enrolled/referred in one or more county specialty mental health programs.
- **60** individuals were linked to a county specialty mental health program and received their first service.
 - **22** individuals were linked prior to shelter enrollment

FLORIN/POWER INN SAFE STAY

August 2023 – February 2024

As with new sheltering programs, the first six months are a time for staff to develop the culture of the program and guests to acclimate to new expectations.

The next six months (and beyond) will include:

- Incorporation of access into CAS, allowing better data on referral process
- Overlay of additional re-housing supports with LEAP and other programs
- Additional focus on integration of community-based partners
- More exits into housing and connections into critical services!
